





2013 Financial Highlights




- ➤ Net from Operations \$15.1M
 - 10th consecutive year of positive operating results
- ➤ Total Revenues \$490.5M
 - Essentially flat vs. 2012
- ➤ Total Expenses \$475.4M
 - +1.0% increase vs. 2012
- Unrestricted Net Assets \$207.0M
 - Increase from \$100.6M at Dec. 31, 2012

(\$ in Millions)








