



2017 Probable 1 Projection **Net from Operations** (\$ in thousands)



Proposed 2018 Advance Member Registration Fee

(per National Meeting Long-Range Financial Plan)

- ➤ Base Rate for 2017 Advance Member Registration Fee: \$445.00
- > Change in Consumer Price Index, Urban Wage Earners, Services Category (CPI-W Services)
 - 2016 CPI-W: 297.480
 - 2015 CPI-W: 288.663
 - Change in CPI: +3.05%
- > Base Rate Increase According to Change in CPI
 - \$445 × 1.0305 = \$458.57
 - Rounding to greatest \$5.00 increment = \$460.00
 - Plus Incremental cost adjustment of \$15.00
- Recommended <u>2018</u> Advance Member Registration Fee: \$475.00



Advance Member Registration Fee ACS Chemistry for Life® 2007 - 2018




Society Program Portfolio Management (SPPM)

- Consensus portfolio adjustments reported to the ACS Board of Directors and B&F





MAC By-law Proposal

Committee on Membership Affairs August 2017—Washington, D.C.




Rationale

- Current bylaw restrictions related to membership and dues categories are viewed by many as overly bureaucratic and unnecessarily thwarting efforts to engage in innovative strategies to recruit and retain ACS members.
- The Bylaw amendment would permit a duly authorized Council Committee (along with the Board of Directors) the flexibility to implement innovative new membership and dues categories quickly to halt and reverse a persistent decline in ACS membership.
- At the same time, the proposed Amendment ensures that MAC's activities are overseen and guided, both the by Board of Directors and by the full Council.

Current MAC test initiatives

Auto-renewal

- Launched July 2014
- •7100+ members enrolled in program to-date
- Prevents unwanted extra renewal mailings

<u>Lapsed member incentives</u>

- Launched Nov 2014
- Rejoin ACS at the following discount rates
 - 1 year—15%
 - 2 year—20%
 - 3 year—25%
- •712 reinstated members
- •67% retention rate of those selecting 1-year at 15%

Bundled memberships

- Launched June 2015
- Membership plus other society offerings
- •2200+ members added

Proposed amendment language



BYLAW I Membership

Sec. 5

The Committee on Membership Affairs (MAC) may conduct membership recruitment and retention market testing of SOCIETY memberships, services and benefits, including special dues categories, to provide data regarding alternative dues and/or membership models and categories. In addition, upon approval of MAC and the Board of Directors, the SOCIETY may establish alternative membership categories, models and dues amounts, such as academic, corporate, multi-year, student, lifetime and other types of SOCIETY memberships. MAC shall report on the establishment of any such alternative membership and/or dues models and categories at each meeting of the Council.

BYLAW XIII Sec 3.

m. The Committee on Membership Affairs may conduct membership recruitment and retention market testing of SOCIETY memberships, services and benefits, including special dues categories, to provide data as the basis for recommendations to the Council. The number of individuals included in any test related to dues discounts shall not exceed a number equal to 10 percent of the total membership. Each test shall be limited to three years' duration unless granted prior approval by Council. All test results will be reported to the Council at least once a year. (6/1/12)


